Several projects have emerged, aimed at providing the KI community with assistance at an individual level, and for businesses.

The Kangaroo Island Leadership Growth Series is one such program.

It is aimed at people in our community who aspire to become our leaders of the future; so these can be emerging leaders in areas such as sport, community, industry and business organisations, and local government.

Eleven participants have been selected from the many who applied, and the program will kick off shortly.

Brian Cunningham has been appointed to deliver this bespoke 6-month program, which will include monthly group workshops with guest speakers, individual coaching sessions, and interaction with other business leaders.

This program will stretch them individually and collectively ... and each will bring unique strengths and development needs," he said.

The 11 successful participants are from wide-ranging backgrounds and include Bec Davis, Tamsin Wendt, John Howe, Megan Harvie, Kaila Kirby, Tony Nolan, Kylie Bamfield, Stephanie Wurst, Rick Morris, Stephen Morgan and Kevin Riggs.

Tamsin Wendt is delighted to be part of the program.

"I applied for selection as a female professional living and working in a rural area, and hope to develop and improve my leadership and communication skills, personally and professionally. I hope my involvement will increase my confidence and ability to engage in leadership opportunities, within the Kangaroo Island community and professionally at a wider level," Tamsin said.

So too, Bec Davis, who said, "I have a strong interest in community development and in improving the social health of my community. This program sounded like a great opportunity to learn new skills that would help me contribute toward making KI a better place for the people who live here."
